Project Description

The Canyon County Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) is seeking funds to hire a Secretary of Interior-qualified professional to complete a National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) nomination (with owner permission) for a district that will include homes at 6466 and 6424 Elm Lane, Nampa ID, 83687. The district will include two homes, a barn, and several other outbuildings that combined help to illustrate Canyon County's agricultural history. Architectural historians at the Idaho State Historic Preservation Office have already deemed the property eligible for the NRHP. Our intent is to add the property to the NRHP, encourage advocacy of such sites, and continue our community's goal of acknowledging our agricultural history.

This project meets Goal 1 of the 2016-2022 Idaho Historic Preservation Plan (IHPP), "Ensure that decision makers, at all levels, and the general public are informed and knowledgeable about historic preservation issues, practices, opportunities, and its value, and take an active role in historic preservation efforts," as the nomination will not only add an Idaho site to the NRHP, but it will also show the community the value of historic cultural resources and the benefits of the NRHP. The listing of the property will illustrate to decision makers that we (our CLG and partners, like SHPO, and property owners) care about and are continuing to preserve historic resources within Canyon County. Listing the site also has the potential of encouraging other private property owners to pursue nominations or allow architectural or archaeological surveys of their property, as they will understand that it does not impact their property rights. This project also meets Goal 3 of the 2016-2022 IHPP, "Ensure that historic preservation efforts throughout the state are aware of and have access to sufficient and sustainable sources of financial support and incentives" as this grant, and similar work, by our HPC is often dependent on grants like these.

This project also meets several goals and objects of the 2018 Canyon County Historic Preservation Plan. These include Goal 1, Policy Objective 1.C "Identification and Designation"; Goal 2, Objective 2.C "Improve Partnerships and Collaboration"; and Goal 4, Objective 4.A, "Amplify the heritage tourism program for Canyon County." Forming relationships with private property owners (per Objective 2.C) has proven to be difficult for our CLG. The partnership created by pursuing this nomination will hopefully serve as a model for creating future relationships with property owners and community members. This will help us to work together to pursue the preservation of like-properties and other cultural resources in Canyon County.

All work on this project will be completed by professionals who meet, or exceed, the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards.

Final Products

January to April 2027 - Consultant does research, fieldwork, etc.; Consultant provides, at a minimum, monthly updates to Parks staff and SHPO on progress

April 2027 - Check in meeting with Consultant, Parks, SHPO

August 2027 - Draft of nomination is submitted to Park staff for review; Staff provide comments by September

October 1, 2027 - Draft NRHP nomination due to SHPO

After October - SHPO review NRHP nomination, work with consultant on any changes

August 2028 - Parks submit final report
